Thomas Harrison Memorial Trophy

Top Monthly Pictorial Image

 Thomas Harrison served as president of the club (1950-51) and editor of Focus at the same time. Between 1952 and 2007 this trophy was given for the top colour slide.






















3M Trophy

Top year-end Pictorial Image depicting a human portrait or character study

 This trophy was presented to the club by the 3M Company to honour Canada's 1967 centennial year. Originally for slides, now for pictorial images.









Bodhan Switajlo Trophy

Top year-end Urban Landscape Projected Image

- To honour the memory of Bohdan Switajlo, a well-known print-maker who was also a landscape painter in his early years, the Board initiated this trophy. It hoped to extend the "idea of landscape beyond nature to urban and other non-conventional approaches" (Focus Summer 2004, pg. 22).
- From 2004 to 2011 the trophy was awarded for landscape prints and since 2012 it is awarded for urban landscape projected images.









Charles Miller Memorial Trophy

Top Series of Projected Images depicting TCC Outings

- Charles Miller was a much-loved member of the club for over 25 years; he never missed an outing. The trophy was donated to the club by his wife.
- The trophy has been awarded since 1969
















































McGregor Nature Trophy

Top Monthly Nature Image

- This trophy was donated in 1956 by active club members Harry and Kay McGregor to promote Nature photography which was in its infancy at the time. Their home was always open to judging sessions and workshop activities.
- Harry died in 1964. Kay was a superior Nature photographer, achieving an ARPS (Associate of the Royal Photographic Society). in 1966. She was a judge, chaired the Nature competitions for many years, and gave workshops and lectures. Her work was published in nature magazines and calendars


































David Nicholls Memorial Award

Top year-end Nature Landscape Image

- The David Nicholls plaque reflects David's own interest in the natural landscape. A reproduction of one of his own photos – "a dramatic ancient tree against an ancient seashore" – is laser-etched onto the trophy.
- Throughout his membership in the TCC David served as president (1986-88), chairman of the nature division and Sunday night programs. He was also one of the founders of the O₃C (Ontario Council of Camera Clubs).
- Commencing in 2012 it is awarded for a nature landscape image.







Christopher Siou Trophy

Top year-end Authentic Wildlife Nature Image

- The Christopher Siou Trophy was established by the Board of Directors in 2014 to commemorate the occasion upon which Christopher became the member of the Club who had the most lifetime winning images in the history of the Club.
- Although Christopher's interests and talents encompass all aspects of Club competitions, his special interest is nature images and he has been chairing the Club's Nature Images competitions for many years.
- Accordingly, the Directors chose this particular interest to honour this lifetime achievement of Christopher's.














David John Wright Creative Images Trophy

Top Monthly Creative Image

- In the Fall of 2009 the Board and Competition Committee decided to rename this trophy the David John Wright Creative Images Trophy in memory of David John Wright. Previously it was known simply as the Creative Images Trophy.
- The trophy has been awarded since 2006



















Digitally Enhanced Trophy

Top year-end Creative Image

- The Board initiated this trophy, recognizing the increasing interest in computer manipulation in colour photography.
- From 2004 to 2011 it was awarded for prints.











Cliff Pugh Memorial Trophy

Top Audio / Visual Presentation by a maker not recently awarded

- Cliff Pugh joined the club in the early 1940's. He specialized
 in portraiture and was a master exhibitor in club
 competitions and salons, receiving Three and Four Star
 Awards of Merit from the PSA (Photographic Society of
 America).
- He was President of the TCC in 1956-57, and in 1963 he was elected a Fellow of the PSA. He was also a judge and master lecturer.
- Cliff Pugh (with others) was instrumental in the purchase of the new building, and in 1967 started the club's School of Photography. The TCC presented him with an Honourary Life membership in 1970.
- This trophy was donated by his wife in 1972. Originally it was for travelogues and is now awarded for Audio Visual Presentations as part of the club's Year End competitions.



Eva Kato Memorial Trophy

Top Audio / Visual Presentation

- Originally, this trophy was awarded for photo essays that were not travelogues, then for "10 minute" photo essays and subsequently for "pictorial" photo essays.
- The trophy was renamed (previously known as the President's Trophy) in 2017 in honour of Eva Kato who was a past president (1995-97) and contributed numerous feature length travelogues to the Club's public presentations.
- It is presently awarded to the maker of the highest scoring Audio Visual Presentation in the club's Year End Audio / Visual Presentations competition
