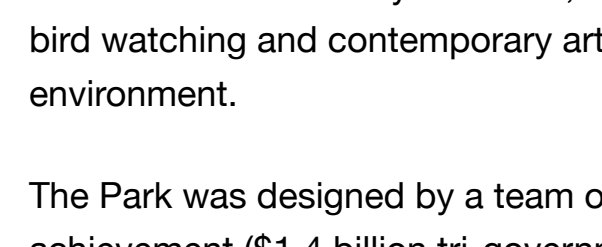
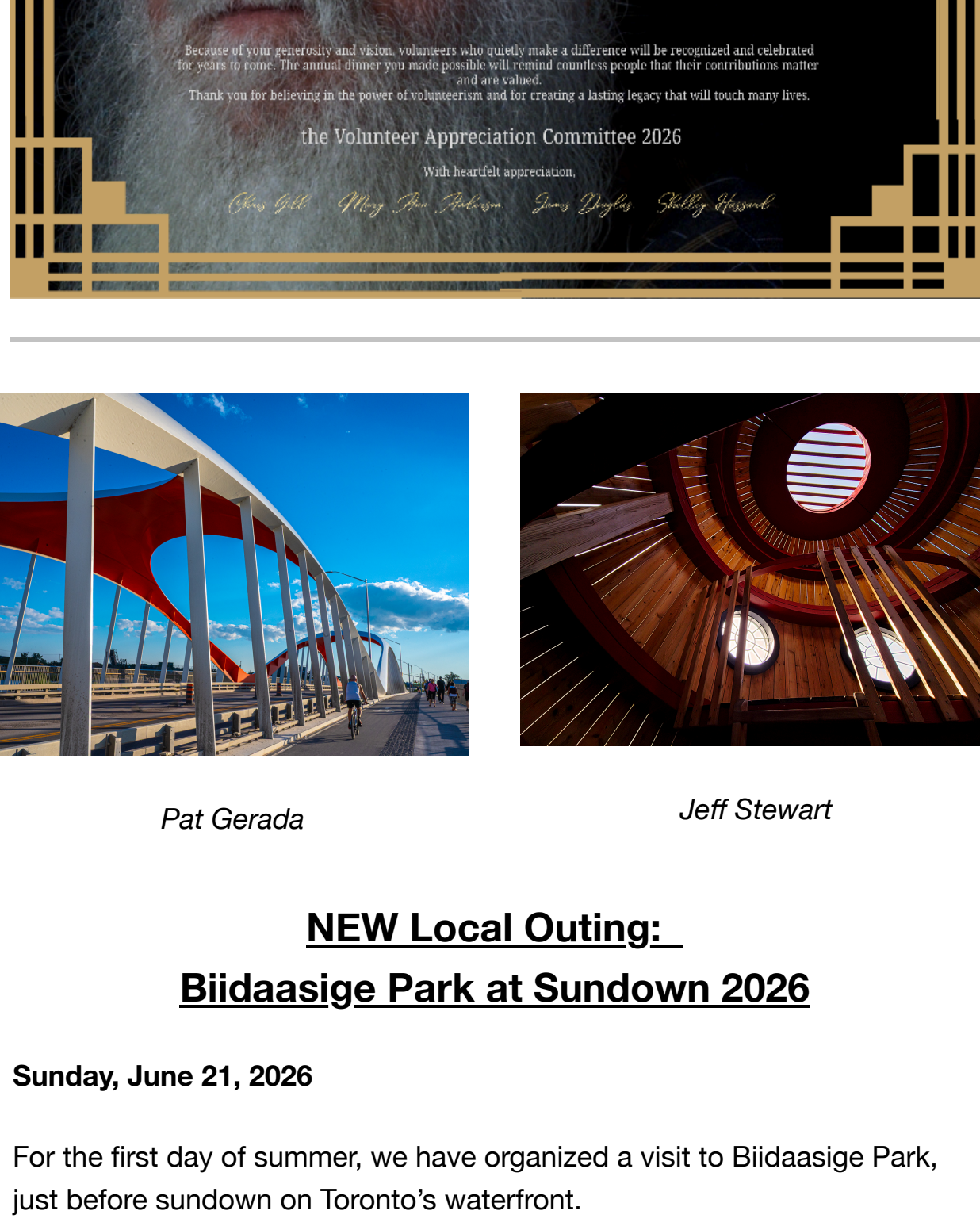
Potential Print Competition Changes

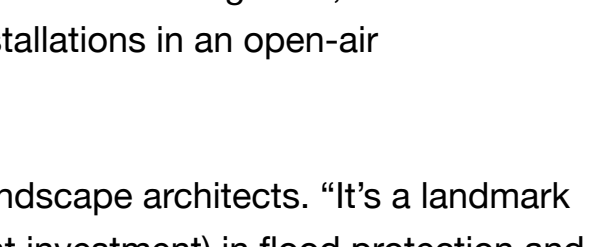

For the first day of summer, we have organized a visit to Biidaasige Park, just before sundown on Toronto's waterfront.

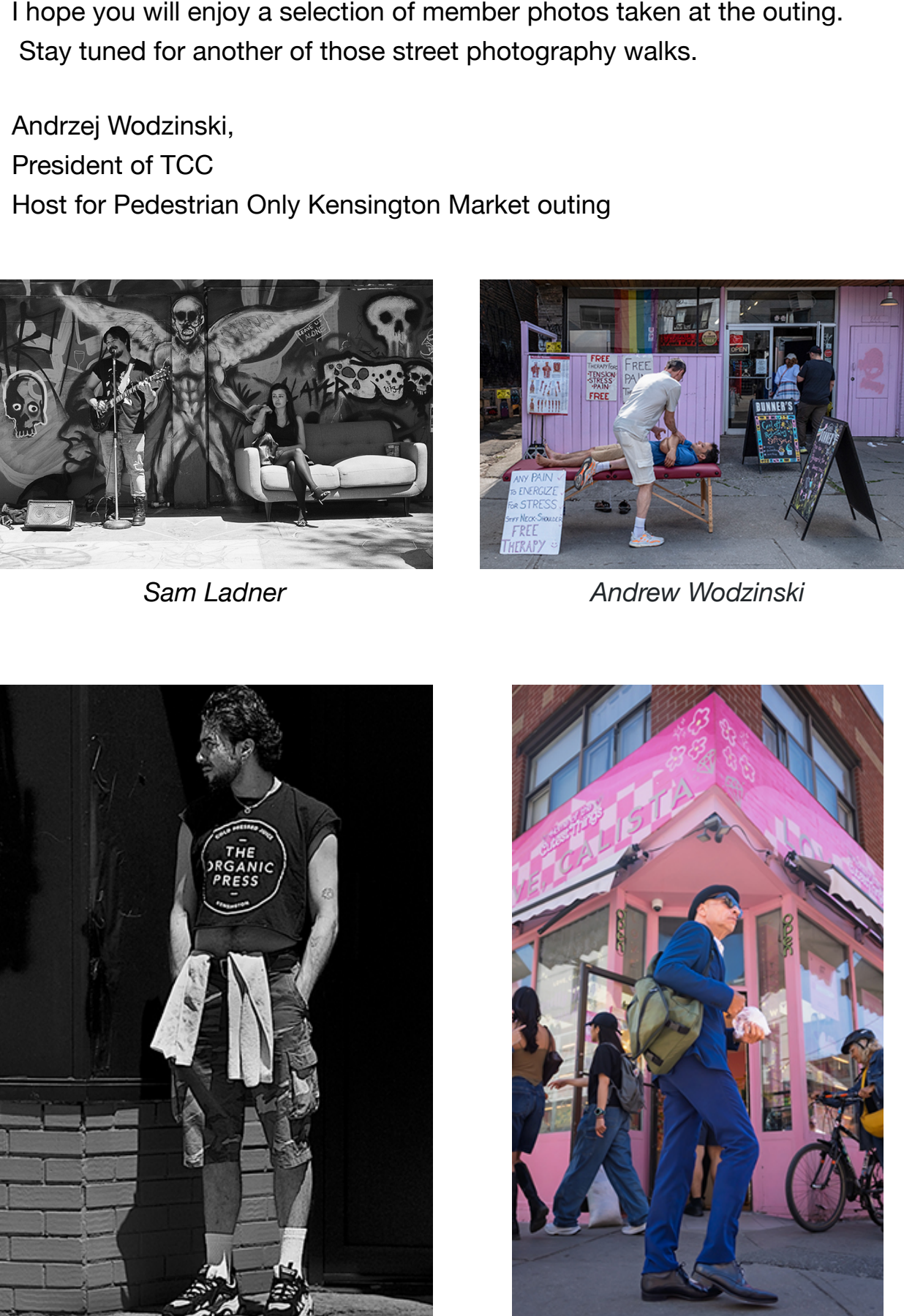
Located on Ookwemin Minising Island in Toronto's Port Lands, the Park offers unobstructed skyline views, recreational walking trails, wetlands for bird watching and contemporary art installations in an open-air environment.

The Park was designed by a team of landscape architects. "It's a landmark achievement (\$1.4 billion tri-government investment) in flood protection and waterfront revitalization".

I hope you will enjoy a selection of member photos taken at the outing. Stay tuned for another of those street photography walks.

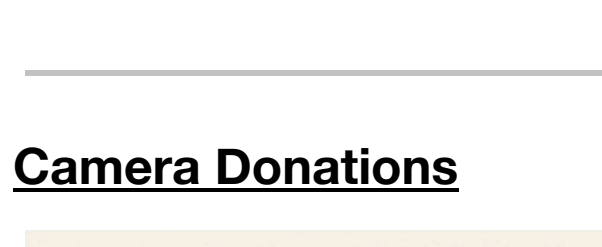

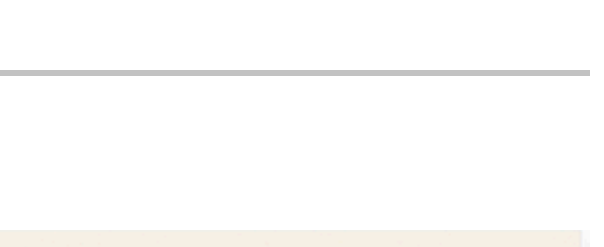
