Koyasan Japan Makers Comments

• Koyasan is the name of a mountain just south of Osaka, Japan. A priest, Kūkai, who brought a certain esoteric sect of Buddhism to Japan from China, was granted permission by the Emperor to build a retreat from worldly affairs on this mountain. He had a vision to make this mountain the religious center of Shingon Buddhism, and he made progress towards that goal in his lifetime. Today, this mountain, with it's significant buildings, monuments and memorials, is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The mausoleum that holds Kūkai is surrounded by the largest cemetery in Japan. Because of it's age, size, and highly spiritual nature, this cemetery is incredible to visit and photograph

Score: 211 Judges Comments

- The various elements of the show generally worked well together. The story of the location was well set up at the start of the show. Viewers could be distracted by the inclusion of one tourist snapshot on the funicular, and by the unknown and recurring element of the aprons
- This show commands attention because of its visual and audio appeal, but also the theme that is developed well and captures the viewer emotionally and spiritually.

- There are many strong images here that contribute greatly to the development of the theme. Most images hold the viewer's interest for the duration they're shown as they are drawn into the deep shadows and misty sunshine.
- The maker worked together the 3 elements (narration, music, forest sounds) in an appealing way. Perhaps water sounds would add to the 'bathing" theme, timed to the display of the falling water images.

- I first conceived this essay before traveling to Florence (Firenze), Italy, in August 2009 as a student of photography and alternative printmaking at the San Reparata International School of Art. My original intent was to create an interactive exhibit featuring images and sounds captured during that month. While a physical exhibit never materialized, this video essay became its ultimate expression.
- My focus was on the streets—the people, the energy, and the everyday rhythms of this historic city, alive with both tourists and locals. My days began at sunrise, chasing the morning light as I wandered through Florence's bustling alleys and piazzas. After a few hours of shooting, I would pause for a cappuccino before joining my classmates for discussions and sharing our work. Lunch and an afternoon nap became necessities, as the sweltering 45°C heat made midday exploration unbearable.
- I ventured out again late afternoon, embracing a "second day-in-one" to capture the golden hour and the city's evening life. Throughout my time there, I also recorded the ever-present sounds of the streets, preserving the auditory essence of Florence alongside its visual beauty.

Splash Makers Comments

- This video shows my images of droplet collisions and splash photography.
- To create a collision of droplets, one droplet is released into a pool of liquid. This first droplet hits the liquid and creates a displacement of liquid to form a crown or corona. The droplet continues into the liquid where eventually there will be a rebound effect called a Worthington Jet. A Worthington Jet and is a small stream of liquid shooting upward. If the objective is to create a drop collision, a 2nd (or even 3rd) droplet is released and if the timing is right, it will collide with the Worthington Jet to create unique and often unrepeatable sculptures of liquid.
- Speedlights or strobes are used to freeze the liquid, and by adding gels, you can create images with different colours. Liquids used in these images ranged from water or cream.

- Excellent shots of water droplets.
- Many transitions and effects were used for enhancing each of the picture and in between. Image transitions generally match to the music beats and tempo.
- What a fun and awe-inspiring collection of images that required next level expertise and patience. Well done.
